has resolved that the following Discretions available in the Statutory Instrument, should be implemented in compliance with the Local Government Pension Scheme Regulations as set out below:-

PART A - where formulation of policy is compulsory

Power of employing authority to contribute to a

Whether, where an active member wishes to purchase extra annual pension of up to £6,822 (figure at 1 April 2018) by making additional pension contributions (APCs), to voluntarily contribute towards the cost of purchasing that extra pension via a shared cost additional pension contribution (SCAPC)

Policy Decision

BFTC will not normally excercise this discretion. This does not however preclude the Council from funding an employee's Additional Pension Contributions in exceptional circumstances or where there is a financial or practical reason for doing so. The decision must be agreed by full Town Council after consideration by the Finance & Staffing Committee with regard to financial viability with each case assessed on its own merits.

Sch 2, para 1 (1) (c) [TP]

Power of employing authority to apply 85 Year Rule (always excludes flexible retirement) upon the voluntary early payment of deferred benefits

Whether to "switch on" the 85 Year Rule for a member voluntarily drawing benefits on or after age 55 and before age 60.

Whether to waive, on compassionate grounds, the actuarial reduction applied to benefits where the employer has "switched on" the 85 Year Rule for a member voluntarily drawing benefits on or after age 55 and before age 60.

BFTC will not normally excercise this discretion. This does not

however preclude the Council from excercising this discretion in exceptional circumstances should it decide following receipt of information in respect of the financial implications to the Council. The decision would be taken to Full Town Council after consideration by the Finance & Staffing Committee

Policy Decision Regulation BFTC does not provide blanket consent for staff to flexibly reitre and Regulation 30 (6) [R] draw immediate payment of any pension benefits. Each flexible retirement request will be agreed by Full Town Council after Flexible retirement consideration by the Finance & Staffing Committed with regard to its merits and will only be agreed if it is in the Council's interest to do Whether all or some benefits can be paid if an employee aged 55 or over reduces their hours or grade (flexible retirement) whether, in addition to the benefits the member has accrued prior to 1 April 2008 (which the member must draw), to permit the member to choose to draw all, part or none of the pension benefits they accrued after 31 March 2008 and before 1 April 2014, and / or all, part or none of the pension benefits they accrued after 31 March 2014 Whether to waive, in whole or in part, actuarial reduction on benefits paid on flexible retirement.

Regulation 30 (8) [R]	BFTC will not normally excercise this discretion. This does not however preclude the Council from waiving the actuarial reduction
Power of employing authority to waive actuarial reduction	in exceptional circumstances following consideration of the merits of each application. The decison would be agreed by Full Town Council after consideration by the Finance & Staffing Meeting.
Whether to waive, in whole or in part, actuarial reduction on benefits which a member voluntarily draws before normal pension age.

Regulation 31 [R]	BFTC will only excericse this option in circumstances of redundancy, or termination of service on the grounds of the efficiency of the service. In all such cases any award will relate to the age and length

Whether to grant additional pension to an active member or within 6 months of ceasing to be an active member by reason of redundancy or business efficiency (by up to maximum amount).

Power of employing authority to `switch on' the 85 year rule upon the voluntary early payment of deferred benefits

Whether, as the 85 year rule does not automatically fully apply to members who would otherwise be subject to it and who choose to voluntarily draw their deferred benefits (on or after 14 May 2018) on or after age 55 and before age 60, to switch the 85 year rule back on in full for such members

For members (excluding councillor members) who ceased active membership between 1 April 2008 and 31 March 2014

This does not however preclude the Council from excercising this discretion in exceptional circumstances should it decide following receipt of information in respect of the financial implications to the Council. The decision would be taken to Full Town Council after consideration by the Finance & Staffing Committee

Power of employing authority to switch on the 85 year rule upon the voluntary early payment of a suspended tier 3 ill health pension

Whether, as the 85 year rule does not automatically fully apply to members who would otherwise be subject to it and who choose to voluntarily draw their suspended tier 3 ill health pension (on or after 14 May 2018) on or after age 55 and before age 60, to switch the 85 year rule back on in full for such members

For members (excluding councillor members) who ceased active membership between 1 April 2008 and 31 March 2014

Policy Decision

BFTC will not normally excercise this discretion. This does not however preclude the Council from excercising this discretion in exceptional circumstances should it decide following receipt of information in respect of the financial implications to the Council. The decision would be taken to Full Town Council after consideration by the Finance & Staffing Committee

This is also subject to the agreement of the Pension Administering Authority
Where an active member requests to transfer previous pension rights into the LGPS, the member must make a request within 12 months of becoming an active member. Whether to extend the 30 day deadline for member to elect for a SCAPC upon return from a period of absence from work with permission with no pensionable pay (otherwise than because of illness or injury, relevant child-related leave or reserve forces service leave)
