35. PLANNING APPLICATIONS

35.1 <u>Planning Application P/FUL/2022/03360 – Former Priory Hospital Fairfield Bungalows</u> <u>Blandford Forum Dorset DT11 7HX</u>

A proposal was made by Cllr S Hitchings and seconded by Cllr L Hitchings but was withdrawn. It was then PROPOSED by Cllr Carter, SECONDED by Cllr Cross and AGREED (13 in favour, 1 against) that

The Town Council writes to Dorset Council thanking the officer for his comprehensive reply to its recent objections to the planning application and that the Town Council has confirmed it will now withdraw these objections. However, Councillors do object to the change of use of 16 selfcontained flats (to be sold at market value) to re-enablement units as it raises questions of the possibility of increased transport in the area and the loss of s106 money, which is urgently needed to support other infrastructure facilities in Blandford. Councillors have asked Dorset Council for clarity on this change of use and questions whether another full planning application needs to be submitted (Blandford + NP policy B1 applies).
