44. PUBLIC SESSION

Tim Gough and Gavin Hall were in attendance to provide Councillors with information about the stopping up application from Hospital Metalcraft. They explained that Hospital Metalcraft is a family business, established in 1953 to provide equipment for the NHS. The site in Blandford Forum was purchased in 1970 and the business has grown since then. The stopping up request has come to the Town Council from the Dorset Council, which hasn't shown any objections to the application at this stage. Mr Hall explained that the stopping up application does meet the tests of the stopping up order. There will be no change to any danger or any worsening of the highway access.

Mr Hall informed members of the demand on the company for the provision of NHS resources. Hospital Metalcraft is making considerable investment in expansion to meet this demand. Unfortunately, there are no ways in which this can be delivered without the stopping up.

Mr Gough added details of the layout, and mentioned the proposed future plans, and explained the current issues with the HGVs navigating their way around the site.

Mr Hall referred to the road running through the Hospital Metalcraft curtilage and explained that nobody has a right of way over that.

Hospital Metalcraft is making these plans in this order due to the timing of sourcing and manufacturing items in time for supply.

49. TOWN CLERK'S REPORT & CORRESPONDENCE

D-Day Events Summary and Expenditure – The Town Council and the Legion received positive feedback about the D-Day 80 commemorative events, exhibition and Armed Forces Expo. These were memorable and poignant events for the town and were also a pleasure to be a part of. Councillors may recall authorising expenditure of £800 for D-Day events and the Town Clerk can confirm that the budget has, unfortunately, been overspent by £14.05. This is due to a last-minute addition of a sound technician and equipment for both the Noon and 8pm services, because of concerns over attendees not being able to hear the proceedings. Councillors will note that there was a large contribution of £200 towards the events from the Blandford & District branch of the RBL. In addition, the scaffolding for the beacon was generously provided free of charge by Sydenhams (because of it being used for a D-Day event) and the propane gas was kindly donated by Cllr Stevens. We had biscuits, cake, beer and cider leftover from previous events, so only fruit juice and wine were purchased, which also helped save money.

It was PROPOSED by Cllr Cross, SECONDED by Cllr Stevens but NOT AGREED (5 in favour, 6 against) that in light of new information, the Town Council supports the application.

It was PROPOSED by Cllr Lacey-Clarke, SECONDED by Cllr H Miéville and AGREED (6 in favour, 5 against) that

The Town Council objects to the proposed pre-consultation to the application to stop up the highway rights at Land at Blandford Heights Industrial Estate, due to public danger on the highway, worsening of access and major inconvenience to the industrial estate users.

- 58.1 P/FUL/2024/02674 – Sydenhams Hire Centres, Blandford Heights Industrial Estate, Blandford Forum DT11 7TE – Construction of an extension on the north east elevation of the building. Construction of an extension on the south west elevation of the building.

The Town Council has no objections to the application and Blandford+ Policy B10 applies.

- 58.3 P/FUL/2024/00233 – Lot 2, Blandford Brewery, Bournemouth Road, Blandford St Mary – Convert buildings into 24 No. dwellings and erect 17 No. dwellings, form parking.

It was PROPOSED by Cllr Cross, SECONDED by Cllr H Miéville and AGREED (7 in favour, 3 against, 1 abstention) that

The Town Council has no objection to the planning application but asks Dorset Council's Planning North to consider making the following conditions of development:

- 1) Pedestrian crossing – this was promised in the first phase of the development but has not been delivered. The Councillors ask that the developers install a pedestrian crossing, as originally promised, to improve safety for members of the public crossing the road, especially children, the vulnerable and the elderly.**
- 2) The safety aspect of the play area and lack of equipment - the overflow pond is extremely dangerous and must be made secure. Councillors feel that the play area is not fit for purpose and ask the developers to secure the area and install more play equipment.**

58. PLANNING MATTERS (cont.)

- 3) **Lack of parking – Councillors are of the opinion that the developers are providing the bare minimum required legally and feel this is not good enough. They ask that the developers increase the amount of parking.**
- 4) **Dark Skies – Councillors ask that the applicant introduces measures to alleviate the impact on dark skies.**

The Town Council agreed that the planning application complies with: Blandford + NP policies B1 and B10, Design Code CA7, Settlement Layout Codes 1 & 2. Streets & Parking Codes 3 – 8, Built Form Codes 10-12 & 15, Environmental Efficiency Codes 16-20.
