Committee Clerk's Report

<u>Dog Waste Bin request, Angus Close</u> – At the last meeting the committee heard a request from a resident in Agus Close for a dog waste bin to be installed due to the high volume of waste being left on the floor. The committee agreed to contact the housing provider, Sovereign, who owns the land to see if they would carry this out. They responded on 20th August to say that regrettably, they have advised that they would not install this, as they have no infrastructure set up for collections. They have said they will speak with residents and ask those who are dog owners to be more mindful when it comes to disposing of dog waste.

Previous request for traffic calming measures on Park Road — A resident's request for as speed survey on park Road was heard at the last meeting in July. The council responded to the resident informing them that that they agree that speed can be an issue on this road and would support the idea of a group of residents carrying out a speed survey, however the council do not have the resources to be involved in it. The resident declined the idea of volunteering to carry out a speed survey. We contacted the speed survey Team at Dorset Council to see if there were any historical issues with speed on this road. They informed us that a survey was carried out in 2018 the results then showed speeds to be low and as the layout of the road hasn't changed since this survey it is unlikely to be much different now

Market Report

If we need to cancel the street market due to high winds/yellow weather warnings, Dorset council do not charge us for parking compensation.

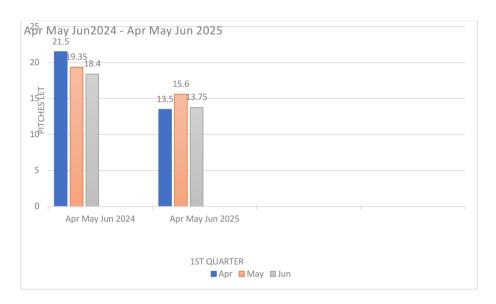

The difference in these figures remain due to the Corn Exchange works and the loss of the Indoor Market and 4 street pitches which cannot be let due to the hoarding. I have had enquiries regarding pitches for Thursdays from Traders who may want to come to market when the hoarding is removed. This includes the Shoe stall who are likely to return.

Indoor Market

The Indoor Market Traders continue their indoor market "tabletop sale" in the Parish Centre opposite Woodhouse Gardens. The Indoor traders have told me that they will be able to return to the Corn Exchange when it re-opens. The Café continues at Woodhouse Gardens and is busy. Lisa from the café at Woodhouse Gardens wishes to return to The Corn Exchange when it re-opens, I continue to follow up new enquiries for stalls.

To discuss a resident's concerns over pedestrian crossing points on Salisbury Road

The following email was sent to the council by a resident on 18th September 2025:-

Salisbury Road is a heavily used route running through the whole of Blandford, and it is especially busy with school students. Currently, there are only two sets of traffic lights along the road, one of which frequently does not work.

Since my son has started walking to school, I've noticed there are very few safe crossing points for children. The only ones available are the lights by the Co-op and the lights by the cemetery. However, there are popular destinations along the road, such as Budgens and One Stop, where many children and other pedestrians cross without a designated crossing. This is a very busy road, and I often see children running across unsafely because they have no other option. The situation is made worse when the traffic lights at the T-junction by the cemetery either do not function properly or take up to 10 minutes to change to a green man light.

Could the traffic lights at the T-junction be checked, and could the council also consider installing either an additional set of traffic lights or a zebra crossing along Salisbury Road to provide safer crossing points?

Background

Recommendation
